Who needs it?

- All students who have not studied in English need to write the English Test.

May I Request an Exemption?

- Yes, if you fall under one of the following categories you may request an exemption by checking the box on the other side and supplying the requested documents.
 - Studied in an English institution for at least a year in a regular program (supply your latest report card from that school)
 - Come from an English background (write a letter explaining your situation)
 - Students who have successfully completed, or are in the process of successfully completing a Secondary IV or V *English Language Arts* course may be exempt. (Please attach and highlight your grades.)

How much is it?

- The fee for writing the English Test is \$30.

Where and When is it?

- The English Test is written at the college (790 Nérée-Tremblay, Québec).
- The English Test can be written on one of following dates at the time specified (please complete and send us your form to reserve your spot):
 - Saturday, February 4, 2012 at 1:00 p.m. in Room 348
 - Wednesday, February 8, 2012 at 7:00 p.m. in Room 348
 - Monday, February 13, 2012 at 7:00 p.m. in Room 348
 - Saturday, February 18, 2012 at 1:00 p.m. in Room 348
 - Wednesday, February 22, 2012 at 7:00 p.m. in Room 348

How long does it take?

- The **English test** should take you about **one hour** to write.
- Note that if you are applying in the Creative Arts, Literature and Language Programme (500.A7) you may also be asked to write **Spanish and/or German Placement Tests** (maximum time **one hour**).

How do I register?

- You can register by completing and returning the English Test Registration Form found on the other side of this sheet and returning it along with your payment of \$30.

How am I evaluated?

- You will be evaluated on the result of your English Test as well as your high school results (*Relevé des apprentissages* from last year and your Secondary V results to date).

What grade to I need to pass?

- There is no passing grade as such, as various factors are taken into consideration. Some students may be accepted on the condition that they follow an English course during the summer (obligatory). Other students may be invited to follow an English course (not obligatory).
